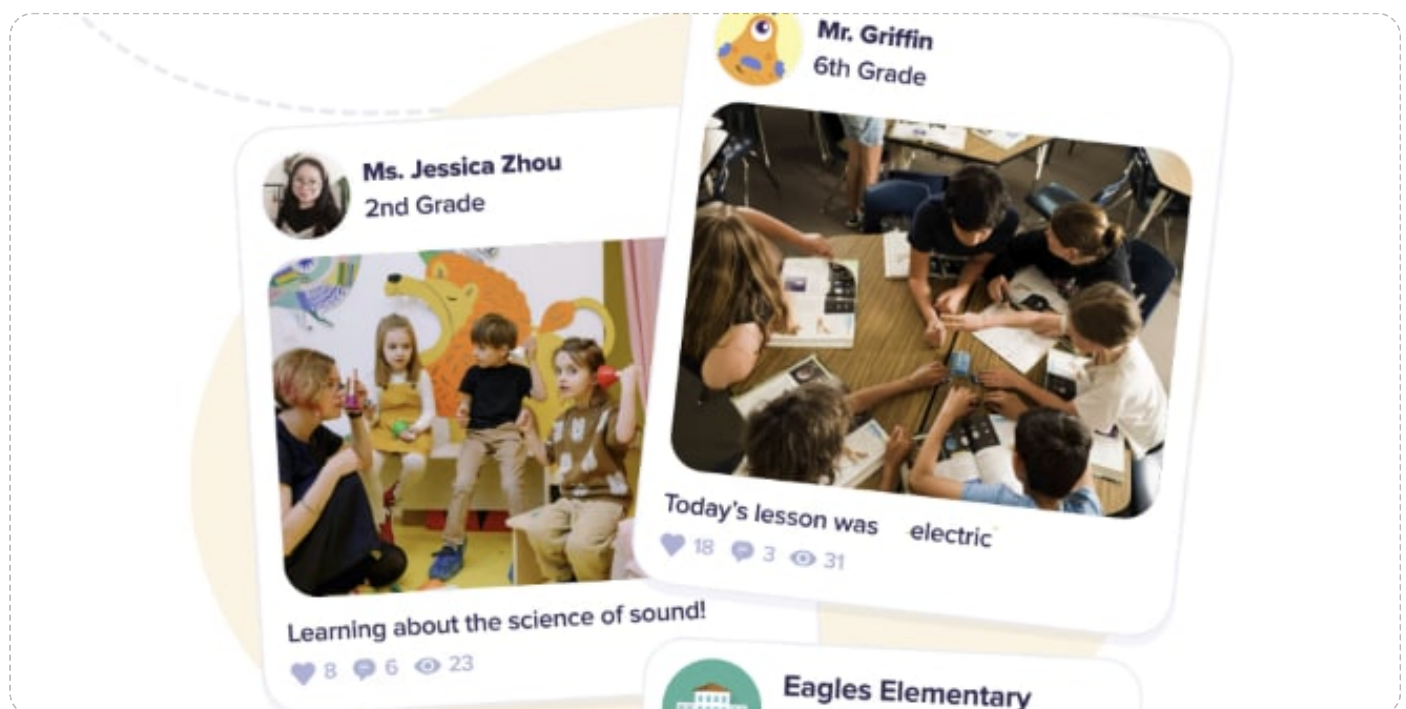

Real academic English, the international-school way

Not conversation textbooks — the coursebooks international schools actually use

We do not teach from generic conversation textbooks.

Lessons use the **official English coursebooks of the Cambridge curriculum** (Primary and Lower Secondary), adopted by international schools worldwide.

Rather than simply practising speaking, students learn exactly as international-school students do — **reading texts, grasping concepts and writing logically** — truly academic English.

This is what decisively sets MEC apart from conversation-focused academies. Students aiming for international school and beyond are exposed from the start to **English as an academic discipline**.

It's a curriculum, not conversation — the very English of international-school classrooms.

But a curriculum alone cannot close every individual gap →

Designed for balance — filling in what's missing

What group lessons can't reach, 1:1 targets precisely



Group lessons alone cannot pinpoint each student's weaknesses — especially **Speaking and Writing**.

So MEC uses 1:1 lessons to diagnose each student's gaps and close them precisely, balancing **all four skills — reading, listening, speaking and writing**.

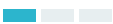
Academic input built in group class is digested in 1:1 and **converted into spoken and written output**.

Higher types add more 1:1 periods, raising the intensity of personalisation.

Group fills, 1:1 balances — connecting input to output.

Once they can speak and write, the next step is the power to read and understand →

Read, understand, express — the skill this era demands

This is the age of reading, understanding and expressing

Speaking and listening alone are no longer enough. What matters now is the ability to **read vast information, understand it, and express it in your own words**.

The root of that ability is a reading habit — yet building one while also studying English is far from easy.

MEC turns this hard task into **a daily routine**: every day, read one book → understand it → summarise it, again and again.

Twenty books in a month. The goal is not the count itself, but making the process a habit — so your child **keeps reading independently long after camp ends**.

A book a day, twenty a month — they leave with a reading habit.

And so all this study never exhausts them, English becomes a tool →

Not playtime — a design that turns English into a tool

Robotics coding and chess are not breaks — they are learning by design



Studying English all day actually lowers a child's efficiency. That is why activities like robotics coding and chess are scheduled daily.

But this is no mere playtime. Its purpose is for children to see English not as a subject to study but as **a means of communication**.

Building a robot or playing chess, the child is no longer learning English — **they are learning something else in English**. This is where English decisively shifts from goal to tool.

Learning other subjects — coding, strategy games — through English, children internalise how language works in the real world: language is a means of getting things done.



Robot Coding

Building and programming robots from English instructions — creativity and problem-solving.



Chess Class

A strategy game learned in English — calculation and strategic thinking.



Sports Stacking

Speed stacking for reflexes and focus — joyful immersion.



Not time spent learning English — time spent learning in English.

EduCity — how the four elements fill a day

45-minute lessons with 5-minute breaks. Each campus runs differently: EduCity splits arrival times into **Batch A / Batch B**, and every type (BASIC · PLUS · INTENSIVE) is offered on this campus.

Batch A / Batch B — different arrival times

Arrival is split into two batches to manage class sizes and rooms. **Batch A starts at 08:10, Batch B at 09:50**, with different lunch times. Assignment follows the placement test and class grouping.

PLUS · INTENSIVE I — built by adding 1:1

PLUS adds one 1:1 period to the Batch A timetable; **INTENSIVE I** takes two 1:1 periods first at 08:10 and 09:00 within Batch B. Group, reading and activity sessions stay the same. **INTENSIVE II runs only at the Forest City campus.**

Forest City runs Plus and Intensive — no Basic — with Intensive in both types I and II (II is exclusive to Forest City). Type II starts earlier with an extra 1:1 period at 08:10. Plus after-school swimming and outdoor sports (Forest City only).

INTENSIVE I — starts 09:00

Three 1:1 periods, four group lessons, then reading and the daily activity. **Three 1:1 periods** are a fixed part of the day.

INTENSIVE II — starts 08:10

Same timetable as I, with **an extra 1:1 period at 08:10** for an earlier start — ideal for students who want maximum 1:1 density.



After class — Forest City's own after-school

Swimming lessons (2×/week · 19:00 · 20:00) · Reading & Homework Club (19:00–20:30) · board games · water park and beach activities — the afternoon and evening routine carries on.

Sailing — SeaQuest Academy

A certified dinghy-sailing academy on the beach in front of the Forest City campus. One level is 18 hours in total — juniors Fridays 13:30-18:00 over 4 weeks, adults Sat-Sun over 3 weeks.

Water Park & Water Sports

All ages

Pulau Satu, overlooking the Singapore Strait. Open into the night — ideal after class — with weekday multi-entry passes.

Swimming lessons

Juniors only

Twice weekly (Mon-Wed or Tue-Thu) · 19:00 and 20:00 classes, 50 minutes each · groups of 6 · 2-week enrolment blocks.

- **Starter** water confidence, breathing, floating → **Beginner** survival swimming
- **Intermediate** freestyle & backstroke → **Advanced** breaststroke, butterfly, turns
- Level assessed in the first session · adjusted for rain or lightning



After-school Reading & Homework Club

Juniors only

A close-support session that keeps English exposure going after class and helps children consolidate the day's learning. More than self-study, it builds a **reading habit and a self-directed study routine**. Weekdays 19:00–20:30 — 45 minutes of guided reading, then 45 of homework and correction. Small groups set by level.

Pre-arrival assessment · adaptive test

All four skills assessed for exact class placement

Going beyond fragmentary grammar-and-vocabulary checks, the test **precisely evaluates everything from grammar and vocabulary to reading, listening, writing and speaking.**

An adaptive format: question difficulty adjusts automatically to each answer.

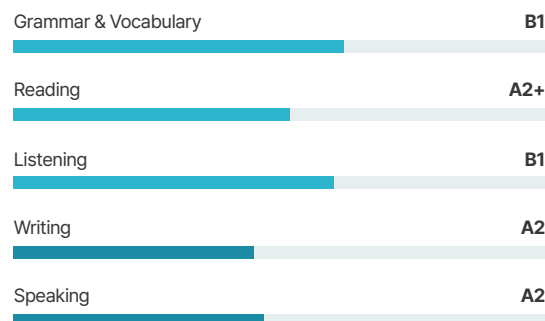
